

ASSESSOR'S OFFICE: <u>The Renter's Relief program</u> will begin April 1 and will run through October 1st. You will need proof of rent payments and utilities paid in the 2023 calendar year.



Renter's Rebate

Renters Rebate applications are being accepted through Monday, September 30, 2024. Columbia residents age 65 or older by 12/31/2023 or those receiving Social Security Disability may be eligible if their 2023 income was \$43,800 or less for an individual or \$53,400 or less for a married couple. There is no asset limit for this program. Required documents include: Verification of income (Signed 2023 1040 Federal Tax form (if you file); 2023 Social Security Statement (SSA-1099); 2023 Pension Statement(1099); 2023 Bank Interest Statement(1099); Any other 2023 Income 1099), rent paid, and utilities paid in 2023. Eligible residents will receive a rebate check in the fall/winter of 2024.

ASSESSOR'S OFFICE:

MOTOR VEHICLE ADJUSTMENTS

In order to have a motor vehicle bill adjusted we need two forms of proof. Please be aware the tax is a car tax not a road tax.

- The first is a copy of your motor vehicle plate return receipt.
- The second is something proving you got rid of the vehicle. For a list of accepted proofs look on the assessor's website or call the office.
- If you traded a vehicle and kept the same plate do not bring us any documentation because DMV will automatically process the adjustments.

BUILDING PERMIT INSPECTIONS

Inspections for building permits taken out as of October 1, 2023, through May 2024 will begin shortly. Our office will email and mail requests for information or an inspection depending on the type of permit taken. Please respond as soon as possible so that we can finish next year's Grand List on time.

2024 MOTORBOAT LAUNCH INSPECTION PROTOCOLS AND SCHEDULES ~ FOR THE SAKE OF THE LAKE!

Recently a town resident referred to the lake as "Columbia's jewel". Any precious commodity such as our lake needs a protection plan to maintain its brilliance. As we begin the 2024 recreational season the Board of Selectmen (BOS) shared that all town residents have a part to play in protecting the lake. The BOS emphasized the need for all town residents, especially those living in the 1,900-acre watershed area that feeds the lake, as well as users of the lake, to understand the importance of needed protections for the lake and those who use it.

One important protocol is inspections of all motorboats at the town launch. Why? As an example, an invasive species, Hydrilla, has been identified in neighboring lakes, e.g., Coventry Lake. One boat launched on our lake carrying Hydrilla could have devastating environmental and financial consequences that would impact the entire town. It is incumbent on all of us to avoid that outcome. In addition, town ordinances and CT boating regulations require documentation, proof of engine horsepower, and safety checks prior to launching on the lake.ll as checking for invasive species. When approved, two town certification stickers will be placed next to the boat's hull numbers. Once certified, at subsequent launches, invasive species inspections will be conducted at every launch.

2024 MOTORBOAT LAUNCH INSPECTION PROTOCOLS AND SCHEDULES ~ FOR THE SAKE OF THE LAKE!

To begin a motorboat, which is defined as a vessel propelled by machinery, can only be launched, and removed at the town's designated launch located at 2 Beach Drive. The initial launch of the season requires motorboats to be inspected prior to launch. The initial inspection process includes providing proof of Columbia residency, a valid, current registration with hull registration stickers, proof of the engine's horsepower, a CT boating certificate, safety checks as well as checking for invasive species. When approved, two town certification stickers will be placed next to the boat's hull numbers. Once certified, at subsequent launches, invasive species inspections will be conducted at every launch.

The Recreation and/or Marine Patrol staff conduct inspections. For motorboats launched by marinas, the town has worked out a plan with the marinas for the required inspections prior to the initial launch. The same proof of residency, valid registration and boating license, horsepower, safety, and invasive species checks as listed above are required.

REGISTRAR OF VOTERS:

REPUBLICAN PRIMARY

- August 13, 2024 at HORACE W. PORTER SCHOOL, 6am 8pm.
- Only voters registered in the party which is holding the Primary may vote. So, only registered Republicans can vote in the August 13th Primary.
- If you are not currently registered to vote, mail in registrations **must be postmarked** by July 26th, 2024 or you can register in person until noon on August 12, 2024.
- If you are NOT currently affiliated with a political party (registered as Unaffiliated, you must register by Noon on August 2, 2024 to vote during the early voting period, or you can register in person until noon on August 12, 2024 to vote on Primary day.
- New Voters who seek to vote early for the Primary may do so if they file their voter registration application (for a party holding a primary) with the registrars by noon on the business day before the day they want to vote during the early voting period.
- To register, go to **voterregistration.ct.gov** or contact our office.

TAX OFFICE: July 1, 2024 tax bills will be mailed on June 28, 2024. The due date is July 1, 2024; payable by August 1, 2024 without penalty. The mill rate for the 2023 Grand List is 28.12.

Regular office hours are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday from 8:00 am to 2:00 pm, Thursday from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm and closed Friday. Office hours in July and January are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm, Thursday from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm and Friday 8:00 to 12:00.

You can view and pay taxes online. Service fees for tax payments are .95 cents to use a bank account and 2.99% for credit and debit cards.

TAX OFFICE (Continued):

To find your tax bills online:

- go to www.columbiact.org and click on the pay taxes online tab.
- on the next page click on the square that says view/pay tax bills.
- The search criteria will need to be entered exactly how the tax bill is written. last name, space, and your first initial.

You can also utilize this site to look up your payment history. Locate your bill using the instructions above, then hover over the icons in the option column and select tax payment history. If you have any problems using the online system, please contact the Tax Office at 860-228-0230 or taxcollector@columbiact.org and we will gladly assist you.
